

### Genealogy Room at Nottingham Central Library

Members of the Society who live on the Nottingham side of our area may be interested to hear that the new Central Library in Angel Rew (2 minutes walk from the Mount Street Bus Station) is now open and has a vast quantity of material of interest to genealogists. The Genealogy Room is situated on the first floor - ask at the enquiry desk on that floor. Here there is a wonderful collection of books of special genealogical interest: copies of Parish Registers, including a set covering nearly the whole of Derbyshire, calendars of wills from various Consistory Courts and a most interesting set of books on the Old Halls, Manors and Families of Derbyshire, arranged according to Hundreds.

Parish Registers from the following counties are available: - Bedfordshire, Buckingham, Cambridge, Cheshire, Cornwall, Cumberland, Derbyshire, Devon, Gloucestershire, Lancashire, Leicestershire, Lincolnshire, Norfolk, Peak Forest, Shropshire, Staffordshire, Suffelk, Westminster Abbey, Westmorland, Worcestershire & Yorkshire. Wills from the following areas are available: - Berkshire, Canterbury, Chelmsford, Chester, Devon, Huntingdonshire, Ipswich, Lichfield, Lincoln, Northamptonshire Norwich and York.

Census Records - These are on microfilm and are housed in the Local History Room on the third floor, where two scanners are available. A third scanner is available on the first floor

There are also files of old local newspapers and folios of large pictures giving much background information, together with maps, photographs, slides, tape recordings and films. Some duplicate items are available on lean. There are of course many reference books on local history on the open shelves.

There are special lifts and other amenities for the disabled, and the door of the genealogy room opens to 31" from inner edge of door to the opposite frame. In this new series we intend to collect lists of incumbents, information from Charity Boards and may other information we himk may be of interest.
