

## LETTERS RECEIVED FROM DISTANT MEMBERS

# A MURDER STORY FROM MR. & MRS. P. CRESSWELL OF ECCLES MANCHESTER

Reading the murder story in your latest magazine promted us to write and tell you of a murder in our own family history.

In 1471 at COLYNHAY near CHAPEL-EN-LE-FRITH, ROBERT and JOHN CLOUGH, of CODNOR, YEOMEN, RICHARD NERE of BOWDEN, his bondsman and THOMAS HEYWARD, their servant, lay in wait to kill ROGER CRESSWELL and there murdered him. HENRY REDFERN of BOWDEN, YEOMAN and WILLIAM REDFERN aided and abetted them at MALCOFF in BOWDEN. ROGER CRESSWELL'S quarrel with the CLOUGH'S may have arisen from a court case a short while earlier, when he sat as juror.

Property formally owned by the CLOUGH family appears before 1510 to have passed to the VERNON family and Mr. Greaves Bagshawe, the historian, suggests that the VERNON'S, who for generations had held the office of Steward of the Peak, may have had interest enough to obtain a grant of the forfeited property after the conviction of the CLOUGH'S. RICHARD VERNON of HAZELBADGE, bequeathed his property to an illegitimate son, whose descendants conveyed it or parts of it, in 1586 and 1596 to ANTHONY CRESSWELL of FORD HALL.

## A GOOD LUCK STORY FROM MRS. C. DRAKE OF WARRENSBURG MONTANA U.S.A.

My search began when I found a letter to my grandmother, written by her cousin in 1930. Spurred on by the luck others had had against impossible odds, Iwrote a letter to Crispin PHAROAH, - or his descendants at 30 Causey Morley Hill, NEWCASTLE-ON-TYNE, ENGLAND.

Two months later, I received a letter from a grand-daughter of Crispin PHAROAH. She told me that the little village the letter had been addressed to, had been pulled down many years ago to make way for road construction. The only building left standing is the Causey Inn, where my letter was delivered. Someone at the pub knew the descendants of Crispin PHAROAH and gave the letter to them. The old gentleman had been dead 19 years - he was 89 when he died.

I shall be forever grateful to Elaine PHAROAH for taking the time to reply to my letter and for helping me with information on the PHAROAH-ANDERSON line. It was even more interesting to learn that her mother's brother teaches at the University of Missouri, only 90 miles from here, and was planning to pay him a visit. This resulted in a really happy famuly reunion.

BEARD, Jane wife of Robert, died December 7th 1838, aged 82 years COTTON, Charles Evelyn B.C.L., died March 18th 1857, aged 75 years (remains interred in family vault at Etwall). 50 years Rector of this Parish, also many years at Trusley. This church was restored at his expense and in him the poor lost a kind and liberal friend GRETTON, Ann and Walthall, children of George and Mary Ann, died August 31st 1741, aged 12 years, Walthall died July 5th 1747, GRETTON, George M. A. Rector of The Church of Trusley, died aged 17 years. October 7th 1732, aged 44 years. GRETTON, Mary wife of George, died June 15th 1746, aged 46 years.

DALBURY is a small village situated 1 miles south west of Derby described in the 'Domesday Survey' as "a hamlet of MICKLOVER, belonging to the Abbot of Burton" In the region of Edward II, Dalbury and Dalbury Lees were the property of Sir Robert Holland. Later they were in the hands of Sir Samuel Sleigh, who died in 1679. They passed, through his daughter and co-heiress to Samuel Cheetham Esq. of BELLAPORT, SHROPSHIRE, who married the other co-heiress. The church, dedicated to 'ALL SAINTS' is a small ancient structure, situated at the end of a tree-lined lane which once led to the 'lost' village of ASH. ## THE MORMON LIBRARY

They give, alphabetically and chronologically for each parish, the baptisms and marriages on which they have data. These parish print-outs reduce the tedious task of searching a parish register or bishop's transcript from hours to minutes. Quickly, one can tell whether of not a particular entry is in a certain parish, as all entries of a particular family for generations are listed on one or two pages.
